Location: Somerset Elementary School (under the covered basketball area outside, in the back of the school)


Safety Protocols: We thank you in advance for following these:

- This will be an outside event. Dress for the weather.
- Students may be accompanied by 1 parent only. We ask that students go straight to
  the picture-taking area near the playground in the back of the school, following
  physical/social distancing guidelines. Staff will be available to assist students
  through the line. When your student has taken their picture, we ask that you do not
  stay on the school grounds/playground.
- All students and staff will be masked at all times—except for the short time that the student removes the mask to take a picture.
- Physical distancing is required.

Please note that students are not required to attend/participate. For any families that do not feel comfortable participating, please submit your student's picture for the yearbook following these guidelines:

- Take a headshot of your student in front of a white background
- Take the picture from the waist up
- Use lighting from the front, no backlighting
- Add the following information when sending the picture: first name and last name of your student, grade and teacher name

We are excited to welcome students and staff for in-person learning in a half day cohort model with the following staggered start dates:

3rd Grade: Monday March 29 5th Grade: Monday, April 5

For 3-5 Grade in person learning schedule, please see the chart below.

- Grades k-2 are in person Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday except for 4/19-4/23 quarantine week. Thursday and Friday prior to start dates are for classroom and teacher preparation. Teachers provide async learning.
- Remote days on Wednesday & Friday follow current Schedule.
- Grade 3-5 drop-off is at 143rd Ave SE crosswalk. Use either side of street. Students must use crosswalk Drop off is 8:50 and 12:50.
- Remain in the car until greeted by Somerset staff.
- Please remember to complete health check prior to 8:30 and 12:30 to ensure efficient arrival for student.

<u>Talking Points</u> is a texting app that allows educators to communicate back and forth with families seamlessly in their preferred home language via Text Messages composed on the staff computer and received as texts on the family's phone. You'll see texts from our Attendance Specialist, Tammy Mitchell, reminding families to complete the health check.

## **Submit Your Family Engagement Survey**



## In Memory of Joanie Andrews

## Among Somerset Elementary's FirstStudents and An Accomplished Lifelong Swimmer

SPLASHForward received a generous donation from longtime Bellevue and Somerset resident Tim Adkisson in memory of his wife Joan. The late Joanie (Andrews) Adkisson graduated from Somerset Elementary in 1975 and was one of the first students to attend the then-newly established school.

Joanie's parents, Jack and Janet Andrews, felt it was important for their kids to be safe around the

water. "Our family was boating, and it was a safety measure to make sure they didn't drown," says Jack. They took their kids to swim lessons early on, with Joanie in the stroller watching her older siblings Jill and Ken in the pool. At age five Joanie joined a swim team and began competing in the 8 & Danie; under division. Swimming became a way of life, and a way for Jack and Janet to create a healthy family lifestyle. The Andrews family frequented Somerset Recreation Club, forging friendships and connections within their community, and some of Joanie's team records there still stand. Joanie later led the Newport High School girls swim and dive team to win the State Championship for four consecutive years from 1979 – 1983.

Joanie's story speaks to the importance and impact of a public community pool. From water safety to community connection, exercise to competition, recovery to well-being, access to water has played a central role in Joanie's life.

When Tim reflects on what would have excited Joanie about SPLASHForward, he recalls a time when a little girl was on the pool deck and was so excited to meet Joanie. The girl had just recently broke one of Joanie's records at Somerset Recreation Club and was overjoyed to meet the person who held the record before her. It's this continuity and access for young kids to develop their water safety and love of swimming that really inspired Joanie. Tim's gift honors Joanie's love for the water by helping establish a world class public aquatics and wellness facility in Bellevue to benefit the greater community.


